FOUNDING MEMBER OF THE CIM FOUNDATION (1972)



René Dufour, ing., FCIM Trustee Emeritus, CIM Foundation

René Dufour graduated from École Polytechnique de Montréal in mining engineering in 1954. For the next seven years, he worked for Quebec Cartier Mining and held the positions of planning engineer, chief engineer of mines and mine superintendant, in charge of a 100,000 ton per day mine.

In 1965, he returned to his alma mater, École Polytechnique, as a professor in its mineral engineering department. Later, as head of the department from 1988 to 1991, Mr. Dufour played an important role in the creation of the joint Polytechnique-McGill University bilingual coop program in mining engineering. René Dufour participated in many mining-related missions, principally in Africa and South America, on behalf of the United Nations, the World Bank, the Canadian International Development Agency, Companhia Vale do Rio Doce and others.

He held the position of director on several boards, including Noranda Inc. (for 14 years until 2002), SOQUEM, and Mines Cancor, a mining exploration company. Mr. Dufour has been an active member of CIM and has held various positions, including CIM president (1988-89), District 2 vice president (1976-78) and Distinguished Lecturer (1980-81). He has chaired many committees including the CIM Centennial Corporation from 1994-99.

René Dufour was one of the five founding members of the CIM Foundation in 1972, its president from 1991-97, and has since served as a Trustee before retiring as trustee emeritus of the CIM Foundation in 2016. He secured the Caterpillar and its Canadian Dealers Scholarship (since 1998) and collaborated with past Foundation Trustee Don Worth to secure the Scotiabank Scholarship (since 1998) and the Irene and Arthur Foley Scholarship (since 2000). These scholarships are still being awarded today.

Mr. Dufour has received many awards including the Past Presidents' Memorial Medal (1970), CIM Distinguished Lecturer (1980-81), CIM Fellowship (1994), CIM Distinguished Service Medal (1995), the 2003 Award for Excellence from the Order of Engineers of Quebec, the INCO Medal (2009) Vale Medal for Meritorious Contributions to Mining (2009) and was named CIM Ambassador at Large (2015).

René and his wife Cécile are celebrating their 66th wedding anniversary in May 2022. Cécile has always supported René and has been an important part of his illustrious career path. They both continue to be very active!

CIMF 50TH ANNIVERSARY




As the CIM Foundation prepares to celebrate its 50th Anniversary beginning in April, its Marketing Committee designed a special commemorative pin for its donors. The pin has



REMEMBERING JIM POPOWICH, FCIM





Jim Popowich, FCIM, was among our strongest supporters at the CIM Foundation. A long-time member of our fundraising committee, Jim vigorously supported our local branch events and was always the first to volunteer to champion a good cause and was particularly supportive of our Mineral Card project. Jim was highly recognized by his fellow CIM members, through the Coal Award, CIM Fellowship, and Distinguished Service awards. Jim's mining career took him from Cominco's Pine Point Mine in the north, to Potash in Saskatoon, to the Smelter in Trail, and later to managing coal in the Elk Valley in British Columbia. Jim eventually retired as President of Coal Operations for Teck having made the move to Calgary until his retirement. During that time, Jim was long time CIMF advocate as he understood the huge benefits and influence of our educational institutions. Jim finally settled into retirement in Vernon B.C., where he continued his volunteer work with many community groups. As President of CIM, for 2007 and 2008, Jim always stressed the values of family, communities, corporate, and social responsibility, much before the present "green revolution".

The CIM Foundation continued to work with NRCan in 2021 by providing mineral cards for distribution during their educational events focused on students.

CIM FOUNDATION KEY EDUCATIONAL OUTREACH / PARTNERSHIPS

In May 2021, Parc Safari inaugurated a mineralogical exhibition in its "Discovery Pavilion", an indoor area dedicated to education about natural sciences, evolution and human development throughout history. With the participation of the Montreal Mineralogy Club and the Redpath Museum, the exhibition was a great success and was appreciated by some 200,000 visitors during the 2021 season.

As a member of the board of directors of the Club de Minéralogie de Montréal, I helped develop the minerology part of this educational project. The Pavilion provided interactive animation about minerals and demonstrated the importance of the mining industry. Several thousand M4S cards were distributed and CIMF Mineral-Match panels were displayed.

In 2022, Parc Safari will celebrate its 50th anniversary and plans are already underway to expand the exhibition and develop a program for school groups. It is anticipated that 320 000 visitors will be welcomed from May to October 2022. In addition, Parc Safari plans on extending its opening next winter and the "Discovery Pavilion" will be one of the main indoor attractions offered to visitors.

CIM FOUNDATION AND MINERALSED ROCKS, MINERALS, AND BC'S MINERAL RESOURCES



Supporting and encouraging mining, mineral resources, and Earth Science education in BC schools is a challenging and rewarding task. Providing materials and resources that teachers and students can use to better understand the importance of mining and minerals in their everyday life is paramount for the minerals industry.

It is through the support of organizations like the CIM Foundation that MineralsEd can provide these resources. The Mineral Identification Cards have been a staple in our teacher support packs and resource unit kits for years and have benefited thousands of teachers and tens of thousands of students over that time. These cards help teachers and students understand the important characteristics, such as hardness, specific gravity, and composition, while also providing real-world examples of how they are used in everyday life. This addition to each teacher's tool kit helps students better understand the importance of mining and when paired with physical hand samples from MineralsEd, paints a full picture of the world around them.

With MineralsEd's new Resource Unit "Early Aboriginal People's Use of Rocks and Minerals" the CIM Foundation has once again provided mineral-specific identification cards. These cards pair with physical samples of obsidian, iron ore, coal, malachite, and flint to fully demonstrate that rocks and minerals have played a part in our lives for thousands of years. Students can use the cards at each station where hands-on activities demonstrate how these minerals and rocks were used for art, hunting, and building.

Don Worth, FCIM, (1932-2021) served as President of the CIM Foundation (1996-1997) and continued as a member of its Board of Trustees. Don helped secure two important scholarships for the Foundation, the Scotiabank Scholarship in 1998 in celebration of the CIM Centennial and then the Irène Foley Scholarship which became the Arthur and Irène Scholarship for students at the école Polytechnique in Montreal. Don worked in mining in Mexico, Quebec,

and Ontario before becoming the CIBC Mining Specialist and their Vice President of Natural Resources. Don was CIM President from 1996 to 1997 and was a recipient of the Robert Elver Mineral Economics Award, and the CIM Distinguished Service Award.

Jim O'Rourke, (1939-2021) valued communities and knew the importance of mineral education to society. Jim worked tirelessly in promoting the welfare of the mineral industry in Canada and in British Columbia in particular. He was a recipient of the Order of British Columbia, and has won many awards over the years, including his induction to the Canadian Mining Hall of Fame. As President

of Copper Mountain

Mining Corporation, Jim sponsored the Chalcopyrite (Copper) mineral card and rewrote the minerals importance to ensure that the mineral would be better appreciated by students and the general public. Jim was a founder in 1988, of Mining for Miracles, which has raised more than 35M\$ for areas of critical need at the BC Children's Hospital. Jim retired as Chairman of the Board for Copper Mountain in 2019. The Chalcopyrite card is being dedicated to his memory.
