REPORT - NEW IN 2013

CMMF celebrated its 40th anniversary in 2012. During that year, the Board of Trustees discussed new directions for the Foundation for the upcoming 40 years. At the CMMF annual general meeting in Toronto



in 2013, it was agreed that, given that CIM members created and continue to support CMMF, it would be appropriate to align the Foundation more with CIM. Therefore, in 2014, CMMF is becoming the CIM

Foundation. The Canadian Mining and Metallurgical Foundation (CMMF), founded in 1972, will be renamed the CIM Foundation (CIMF) at the annual general meeting in Vancouver in 2014

CIMF continues to be a non-profit charitable organization dedicated to promoting and supporting education in the many facets of the mining world. Through a variety of activities and programs, the Foundation's goal is to promote the mining industry to students from primary school to university through: the promotion of minerals, which is at the heart of the industry; the support of education; and by showcasing mining as an excellent career option. Although a separate legal entity from the Canadian Institute of Mining, Metallurgy and Petroleum (CIM), The CIM Foundation was established and continues to be funded by the generous contributions of CIM members.

CIMF HAS A NEW WEB DOMAIN

CIMF SUPPORTS EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS

During 2013, CIMF continued to support scholarships designed to attract and assist students enrolled in university and technical school mining





CIMF also supported the CIM Distinguished Lecturers Program and Mining for Society (M4S), a CIM initiative that helps build awareness of the industry's importance in our daily lives. In addition, CIMF supported educational programs in public schools through PDAC's Mining Matters and MineralsEd (formerly the Mineral Resources Education Program of BC).





THE MANAGEMENT AND ECONOMICS SOCIETY OF CIM (MES) CONTRIBUTES \$100,000 TO THE MES EDUCATION FUND WITHIN CIMF!

The Management and Economics Society (MES) of CIM contributed \$100,000 to create the MES Education Fund. This amount will be used to provide financial support to the teaching of mineral economics at Canadian universities and colleges, and to provide scholarships in the range of \$5,000 to \$10,000 per year to deserving undergraduate or post-graduate students enrolled in a recognized program at a Canadian university or college).

MES will manage the process of selecting the annual recipient of its MES Education Fund award, based on criteria determined by the society. Those criteria may be modified from year to year to reflect the changing nature of

educational needs. In the case of a lack of a qualified university, college or individual applicant in any given year, MES has the right to not disburse its funds.

MES will work in coordination with CIM and CIMF to advertise the MES Education Fund within both organizations' existing networks.

NEW PIONEERS IN GEOLOGY SERIES' MINERAL CARD IS UNVEILED IN TORONTO ON MARCH 3RD



At the Royal York Hotel in Toronto, Ontario, **Deborah Smith-Sauvé**, Manager of CIMF, and



Dr. Steve Perry, Dean of the Faculty of Science and the Department of Earth Sciences at the University of Ottawa unveiled Lalondeite, the first card in a new Pioneers in Geology series of mineral cards. Lalondeite was studied and characterized by the late Dr Andre Lalonde (1955-2012), who was the former Dean of ience as well as a dedicated

professor and researcher at the University of Ottawa for over 25 years. The Lalondeite mineral was recovered in the nineteen sixties but it was only during the past few years that Dr Lalonde studied and discovered its unique structure. This University of Ottawa event took place on March 3rd, 2014 and was attended by over 200 alumni, many of whom studied under Dr. Lalonde, and are now members of different facets of the mining industry thanks in part to his dedication to geology and the mining industry.

MINERAL CARDS - CIMF'S SIGNATURE PRODUCT!

As part of the CIM Foundations' mandate to promote Canadian minerals, the CIMF signature mineral card project is a valuable asset as it provides information about minerals to students, and includes information about the mining industry by profiling donors through their sponsored card (select ref: halite native copper, magnetite and sylvinite). It also provides information about university geology and engineering programs that lead to careers in mining (ref: galena, quartz and jade cards), and promotes national mineral collections (ref: enargite and ammolite cards) all at www.cimfoundation.ca (mineral cards).

This collection of mineral cards was developed in consultation with geologists and educators across Canada and is at the heart of the mining industry. It has also become the focal point for promoting many aspects of the CIM Foundation's mandate; the cards are available in up to nine languages including English and French and some First Nations languages. As part of the CIM Foundation's outreach program, regional mineral cards are available to CIM branches for their educational events. These cards are used by students of all ages from primary to university level.
