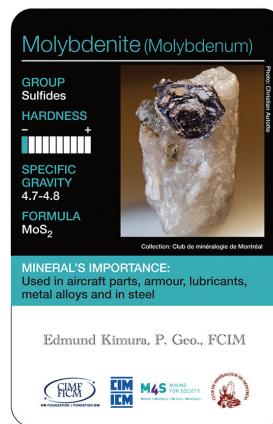
In Memoriam – Mr. Edmund Tsnueo Kimura, P. Geo., FCIM

Taking Flight receives important support and increases the number of scholarships awarded as well as the amount of these scholarships



Thanks to the support of the COSMO Mining Industry Consortium and McGill University Laboratory (<http://cosmo.mcgill.ca>), the CIM Foundation has increased the number of First Nations scholarships awarded annually from two per year to three, as well as increased the award amount of these three scholarships from \$1,000 to \$2,000, bringing them in line with other CIM Foundation scholarships (Caterpillar and its Canadian Dealers, Scotiabank, and Stantec Scholarships). The Taking Flight scholarships also benefit from additional support from the Wyslouzil Family Fund and an anonymous benefactor.

Since its inception in 2009 the CIM Foundation has provided 29 scholarships to First Nations students from 25 communities across Canada. First Nations students often live near mining projects and are valuable potential employees. However, they need to travel to larger cities to continue their education, especially in many facets of mining. 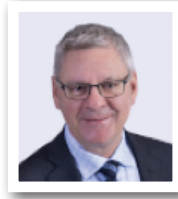
Carlos da Costa, MSc, MSc, Ph.D.

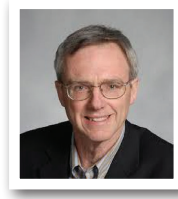

Garth Kirkham, P.Geo., FGC, FCIM

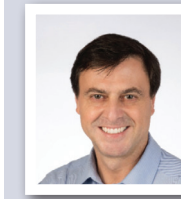

Daniel Gagnon, FCIM

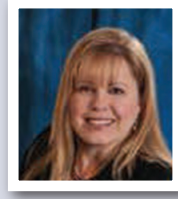

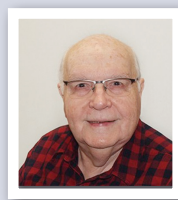
Jo-Anne Boucher

In Memoriam – Roger Guay, Ph.D.

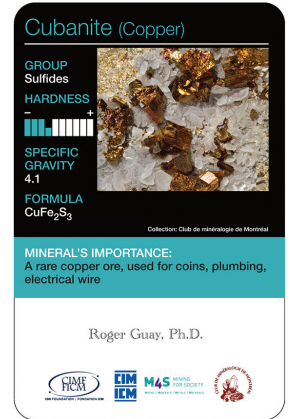

It is with sadness that we announce the passing of Roger Guay, Ph.D., and member of the Executive of the Club de minéralogie de Montréal. Roger was first approached by the Foundation in 2011 to help with the development of a collection of mineral cards. He was quick to accept the challenge and always ready to volunteer his expertise in the development of what became more than 750 mineral cards in up to nine languages. Roger was a respected microbiologist and a retired university professor. He adored students and was always ready to help produce any educational material that could provide a better understanding of some of the minerals that he was so passionate about. Over the years he helped the Foundation develop additional educational tools to further enhance the use of the mineral cards, such as the mineral bingo game, seven mineral-match panels. He was in the process of creating a series of educational online booklets about specific aspects of his favorite minerals.

As always, thanks to our card sponsors, printed Mineral cards are offered to CIM branches and societies for distribution at their educational events. (Contact dsauve@cim.org or dsauve@cim.org). The back of each card includes the link to accessing the website with all of the cards. The term copyright was never used so that students and educators could include them freely in their presentations and school projects. These educational cards were created to be copied!

Roger's favorite card was the Cubanite (Copper) Mineral card which we have named in his memory.



Stantec/McIntosh 2014 Scholarship Recipient Spotlight



Milan Dumoulin-D'Aoust, a McGill alumnus, was the recipient of the Stantec/McIntosh Three-Year Scholarship in 2014. Since first receiving the scholarship, Milan has been a very productive member of the mining community.

His career path began with a four-month internship from May to August 2015 as a truck operator for Syncrude at Fort McMurray. The following year, Milan worked as an intern in Pugwash, Nova Scotia, as a Ventilation Engineer for K+S Windsor Salt Limited from May to August 2015. He then completed an internship as a Mine Engineer with Agnico Eagle Mines Limited developing VBA tools to streamline reporting tasks. Milan graduated with a Bachelor of Engineering (B.Eng.), with Distinction, in Mining and Mineral Engineering, from McGill University in 2017.

Since graduating, Milan has worked as a Project Engineer for ArcelorMittal Canada (January to July 2018), preparing CAPEX proposals and performing risk analysis of technical, scheduling and risk analysis components. He subsequently moved to Rio Tinto, first as a Graduate Mine Engineer working for underground mine operations as a miner (August 2018 to March 2020) in Yellowknife in the Northwest Territories. Milan became a Drill and Blast Engineer in March 2020 and is working for Rio Tinto at the Diavik Mine in the Northwest Territories in that capacity. During his time off, Milan enjoys fishing and hiking. He is looking to enrol in a part-time graduate program to advance his technical skills. CIM's Public Awareness Project "Our Earth's Riches"



One of the core goals of all CIM organizations is to expand awareness of the essential contribution mining makes to society. Traditionally this has been done by branches, societies, and CIM National through M4S and other programs. CIMF has been very active in this area through a number of initiatives that include scholarships, educational mineral cards, and mineral-match panels.

To further this goal and to substantially increase our outreach, CIM formed a partnership with Science North that envisioned a traveling state-of-the-art exhibit that would engage the public across Canada and highlight the essential nature of mining and minerals to our quality of life. As with any major project, this required funding – \$1 million from CIM to be exact. Our first step was to reach out to constituents and our Societies and local Branches, all of whom really stepped up.

CIMF has been instrumental in providing not only a charitable donation platform that provides additional benefits for individual donors but in actively recruiting donations as well. In the process, CIMF identified a private foundation as a potential major donor, and that foundation ultimately contributed \$100,000 to the project. Another major individual donor, Don MacLean, had his donation processed through CIMF as well. With approximately \$500,000 committed to date to the project, we are well on our way.

While the current global pandemic has slowed progress, it has not reduced our resolve. In fact, as we begin to look at new and exciting ways to deliver this project and achieve our goals, we are more committed than ever to rolling out this project in a more accessible format in the not too distant future.

This project is another example of OneCIM in action: CIM constituents working together to make the overall organization stronger and to achieve our shared goals. The team includes CIM National, local Branches, Societies, committees, individual members and, of course, the CIMF – an integral part of the project.
